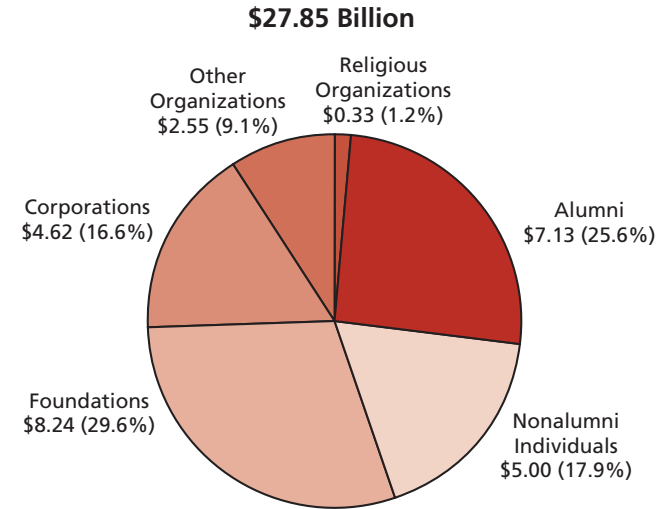
# 2009 National Estimates and Trends for Higher Education

## General Findings

Contributions to colleges and universities in the United States fell 11.9 percent in 2009, to \$27.85 billion, according to the annual *Voluntary Support of Education (VSE)* survey conducted by the Council for Aid to Education (CAE). The \$27.85 billion raised in 2009 represents a decrease of \$3.75 billion from the \$31.60 billion raised in 2008. The 20 institutions that raised the most in 2009 received \$1.13 billion less than the 20 institutions that raised the most in 2008. Historically, alumni and foundations contribute the largest portions of charitable support of
