2008 National Estimates and Trends for Higher Education

General Findings

Contributions to colleges and universities in the United States grew by 6.2 percent in 2008, reaching \$31.60 billion, according to the annual *Voluntary Support of Education (VSE)* survey conducted by the Council for Aid to Education (CAE). The \$31.60 billion raised in 2008 represents an increase of \$1.85 billion over the \$29.75 billion raised in 2007. The twenty institutions that raised the most in 2008 received \$745.31 million more than the twenty institutions that raised the most in 2007. Historically, alumni and foundations contribute the

Voluntary Support of Higher Education by Source, 2008

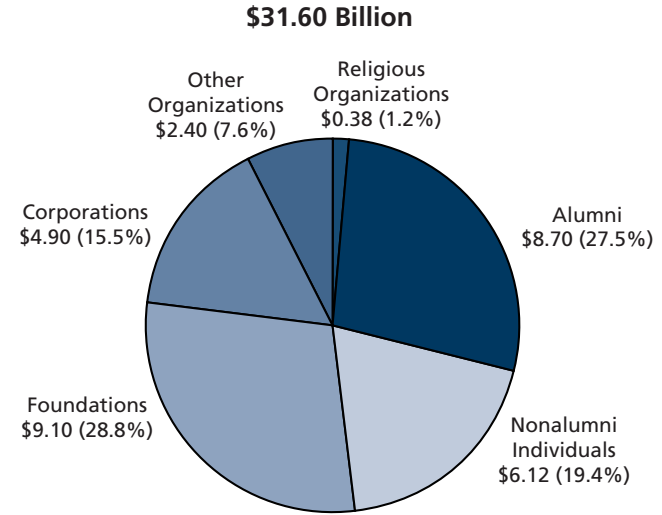
