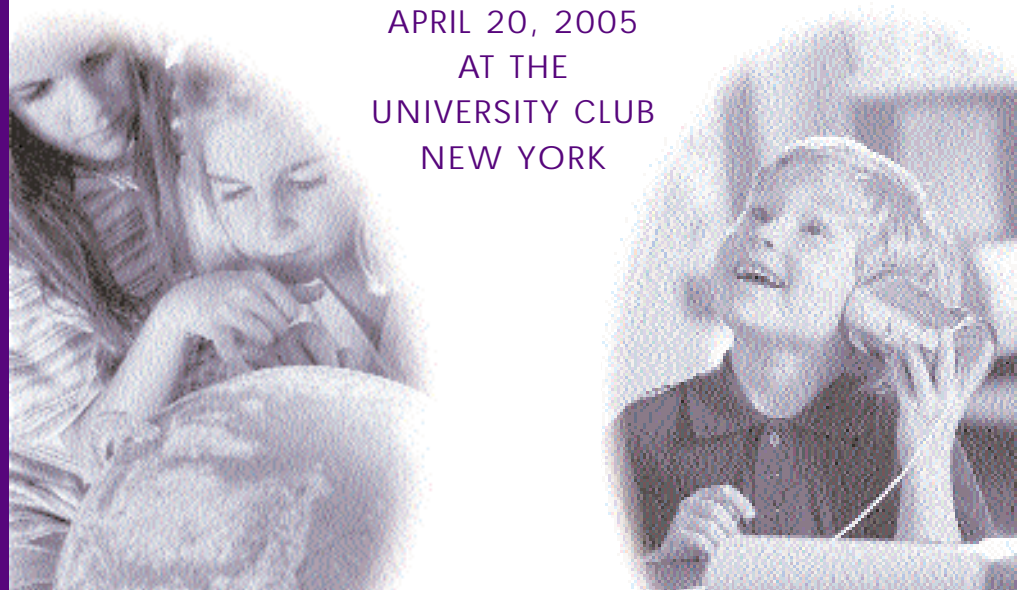

A licensed psychologist, Dean Brabeck is widely published.
